The Last Flight of Concorde 2003

The unrivalled supersonic airliner Concorde was retired from service after 27 years on 26th November 2003. The first Concorde flight took place on 2nd March 1969 and the aircraft entered commercial service on 21st January 1976. The primary users were British Airways and Air France who profitably flew regular transatlantic flights from London Heathrow and Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport to New York in less than half the time other airlines took. 2013

England Win the World Cup 1966

The Football Association, formed in London during October 1863, organised the 1966 FIFA World Cup Finals, the eighth of these tournaments. The magnificent England team, under Manager Alf Ramsey, later Sir Alf, won a sensational final at the old Empire Stadium, Wembley when they beat West Germany 4-2 in extra time, on Saturday 30th July 1966. HM the Queen presented the Jules Rimet Cup to England Captain, Bobby Moore.



HM The Queen's State Visit to China 1986

HM The Queen, accompanied by HRH The Duke of Edinburgh, made a state visit to the People's Republic of China from 2nd to 8th October 1986. President Li Xianbian, President of the People's Republic of China, 1983-1988, was her host. The Queen visited Beijing, Shanghai, Xi'an, Kunming and Canton, and was also shown the iconic Great Wall of China.



President Kennedy Assassinated in Dallas 1963

John F. Kennedy, the 35th President of the United States of America, was assassinated, on 22nd November 1963, by sniper Lee Harvey Oswald as his presidential motorcade drove through Dealey Plaza in Dallas, Texas.

Isle of Man Postal Independence 1973

The Isle of Man became an independent postal administration on 5th July 1973; prior to that the Post Office had been run by the Royal Mail. The Isle of Man Post Office, situated in Douglas, marked postal independence by releasing its first definitive issue - 22 values, 1/2d to £1 - plus an engaging 15p commemorative stamp, showing Viking Landings on Man.
